HOW DOES 3 JOHN FIT?

- Typical explanation of John's Epistles:
- 1 John how a person may know whether or not he has eternal life.
- 2 John welcoming and supporting false teachers / believers would make one a partaker of their evil deeds.
- 3 John welcoming and supporting teachers / believers of the truth make a person a partaker of their good works.

2 JOHN & 3 JOHN

The elder unto the elect lady and her children, whom I love in the truth;...

The elder unto the wellbeloved Gaius, whom I love in the truth. ...

JESUS IS LIFE - BELIEVE HIM!

• John 20:30-31

And many other signs truly did Jesus in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book: but these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through His name.

OUR CONFIDENCE IN HIM

• 1 John 5:13

These things have I written unto you that believe in the name of the Son of God that ye may know that ye have eternal life.

2 JOHN:1 & 3 JOHN:1

2 JOHN & 3 JOHN

Specific examples of true believers who love one another.

i.e. love specifically applied – what does it look like for the challenges of the time?

2 JOHN:4-6

I rejoiced greatly that I found of thy children walking in (true faith in Jesus Christ), as we have received a commandment from the Father. And now I beseech thee, lady, not as though I wrote a new commandment unto thee, but that which we had from the beginning, that we love one another. And this is love, that we walk after his commandments. This is the commandment, That, as ye have heard from the beginning, ye should walk in it.

2 JOHN:7-9

For many deceivers are entered into the world, who confess not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh. This is a deceiver and an antichrist. Look to yourselves, that we lose not those things which we have wrought, but that we receive a full reward. Whosoever transgresseth, and abideth not in the doctrine of Christ, hath not God. He that abideth in the doctrine of Christ, he hath both the Father and the Son.

TRUTH: JESUS IS THE GOD-MAN

Personalities: Whom do you resemble?

Three main characters are mentioned:

Gaius (v. 1),

Diotrephes (v. 9), and

Demetrius (v.12).





I. The Beloved Christian - Gaius

- A. Precious Affection (v.1)
 - 1. John calls recipient the "well-beloved" Gaius.
 - 2. John loves him in the true faith.



I. The Beloved Christian - Gaius

- B. Prosperous (v. 2)
 - 1. Spiritually, Gaius was doing very well.
 - 2. John prays for his physical well-being to be equal to his spiritual well-being.



I. The *Beloved* Christian - Gaius

- C. Profitable (v.3, 5-8)
 - 1. Possessed true belief
 - 2. Practised true belief

Love in action, not just in talk.





 - 1. Wanted to be prominent in position / say —"pre-eminent"



- "I am more afraid of my own heart than of the pope and all his cardinals. I have within me the great pope, Self."




- A. Proud in character
 - 1. Wanted to be prominent in position / say —"pre-eminent"
 - 2. One cause of church / home problems.
 - 3. No respect for the dignity or authority of apostle / elder.





- B. Poor in conduct
 - His speech was evil (v.10)
 - 1. "Prating" i.e. bring an unjustified charge against
 - 2. "Malicious" i.e. active evil.



- His acts were also evil:
 - 1. Refused to entertain needy brothers / itinerant teachers,
 - 2. Excommunicated those who did so.



PERSONALITIES: WHOM DO YOU RESEMBLE?

• 3 John 11

Beloved, follow not that which is evil, but that which is good. He that doeth good is of God: but he that doeth evil hath not seen God.

 - 2. "Truth itself"
 - 3. "We also"
- B. Probably bearer of letter.
