I. The Father is to be Held Accountable

- A. The Man is to be the Head
 - 1. The man as head stems from the created order. (Gen 2:7, 21, 22; 1 Tim 2:13)
 - 2. The husband is the head of both the wife and the family.
- B. The Man is Held Responsible
 - 1. Adam was not the one deceived. (1 Tim 2:14)
 - 2. Eve was deceived, but God confronted _____. (Gen 3:9, 17) (Cf. Eph 6:4)

II. The Father is to be the Spiritual Leader

- A. The Decision of Salvation for his Household (Eph. 5:25-27)
 - 1. The husband is to show the same kind of loving leadership towards his wife.
 - 2. The father is to show the same kind of loving leadership towards his children.
- B. The Decision of Service for his Household
 - 1. Salvation is not an end in itself. Never!
 - 2. What was Joshua's decision regarding service for his household?

III. The Father is to be the Intercessor (Job 1:5)

- A. The Father as the Pious Example Job's Prayer Life
 - 1. Job not only prays but he has a prayer life -A life of prayer.
 - 2. He exemplifies for us that prosperity and piety can go hand in hand.
- B. The Father as the Priestly Example Job's Prays for his children
 - 1. Job's example tells us that pleasure no matter how innocent, dulls the soul towards God.
 - 2. Job as a father was concerned with the spiritual well-being of his children.

IV. The Father is to be the Teacher (Deu 6:6-9)

- A. The Confrontation of God's Command vv6-7
 - 1. Fathers are to be so confronted by God's commands in our entire being. (v6)
 - 2. Fathers are to be so confronted by God's commands to teach their children. (v7)
- B. The Constant Application of God's Command vv8-9
 - 1. Our children must see the reality of God's Word in our daily lives right before their very eyes.
 - 2. They must be able to see that dad (mom as well) is what he is both at home and in church.
